

Information Needed for the 2023-2024 School Year

- 1. All students entering 7th grade must have the Meningococcal vaccine AND a Tdap booster before the first day of school. They cannot start school without those vaccines.
- ·Call your healthcare provider to ask if your child still needs to get these vaccines
- ·A great time to get these vaccines is when kids go in for wellness and sports physicals in the summer
- ·To be valid for school, the Meningococcal vaccine and the Tdap booster must have been given after age 10
- ·Bring an updated lowa Certificate of Immunization from your provider to your child's school
- 2. Students entering 7th & 8th grades (23-24) who plan on participating in sports are required to have an Athletic Physical.
- 3. Incoming Kindergarten students must have
- a. A physical if they did not have one for preschool.
- b. Updated immunizations if needed.
- c. Dental exams.
- 4. Incoming Preschool students must have updated immunizations.
- 5. Any student with a dietary need/restriction MUST submit a Diet & Modification Request Form prior to the first day of school. This form only needs to be updated if dietary needs change.
- 6. Forms are found on the website: Parents-Office Handouts
 It is not too early to schedule these appointments with your health care
 provider. You may submit them to the office at any time but we should receive
 them by the end of August at the latest.






Welcome to RVCS Continued

ESA & Tuition Information 2023-2024

lowa's new Education Savings Account (ESA) program provides families with an exciting new opportunity to enroll students at Rock Valley Christian School

Student First Act (ESA)

The Student First Act, commonly known as the ESA, has passed in the state of lowa. This law allows for parents to create an Education Savings Account. This will have an impact on some of our families already next year. This money can be used to assist in tuition or other qualifying expenses concerning education. We have sent out an information sheet already, but if you would like one or have any questions with this law you may contact Marcus De Jager at marcus.dejager@rockvalleychristian.com. There are still certain rules of this law that have to be finalized so we will keep you up to date on the most current information that we have. We want you all to know that our board is currently working and discussing how this will impact Rock Valley Christian. We WILL stay true to our mission statement here at RVCS through this all. We ask that you continue to pray for the board as they have discussions on the current and future impact from this law on PVCS.

If my Family does qualify for the ESA Program, How can I apply?

- You must apply for an ESA (directly with the state of lowa) no later than <u>June 30, 2023</u> for the 2023-2024 school year. Details on how to apply will be provided soon. RVCS will offer workshops and appointments to help families fill out applications as soon as more information from the state is available.
- If you miss the state deadline (June 30, 2023), ESA funds will not be available to you for the 2023-24 school year. NICSTO and Tuition Assistance funds are readily available.

Who is eligible for an ESA? When does it begin?

The program begins for the 2023-2024 school year, with per pupil funding being \$7,635 per student. Funds are deposited into an ESA each year until students graduate or complete high school or turn 20 (the money cannot be used for college). Applications are due yearly by June 30.

Year 1 (2023-2024)

- All Kindergarten students
- All students transferring from a public school or homeschool
- Christian school students at or below 300% of the federal poverty level

Year 2 (2024-2025)

- All Kindergarten students
- All students transferring from public school or homeschool
- Christian school students at or below 400% of the federal poverty level

Year 3 (2025-2026) & Forward)

 All K-12 students in lowa, regardless of income

Does tuition cover all the cost to educate our students?

No. Tuition typically covers 55-60% of the entire budget. The other portion of the budget comes from fundraising, fair share, foundation, and a few other outside sources.

What will happen with the Fair Share Plan?

Fair Share Plan has been a feature of the relationship between Rock Valley Christian and area churches for many years. The board and school leadership have been in conversation with churches and have received feedback that they are supportive of and thankful for the Fair Share Plan and want it to continue and remain strong; they believe that it is important for families to also contribute toward the cost of Christian education; and they advised as little change as possible as we "ease in" to a new opportunity with ESAs.

What will happen with NICSTO, multi-child discount, and alternate revenue?

Nicsto will remain in place and the multi-child discount will continue for the 2023-24 school year for all students.

What can ESA funding be used for?

There is a list of eligible uses for ESA funds, but tuition and fees at nonpublic school is at the top of the list, and it is a requirement of the bill that the funds must **first be used for tuition** before any other qualified educational expenses.
